GET STARTED IN 1 YEAR OR LESS

HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATOR

Average Salary: \$19.71/hour | \$41,000/year

Education Required: Certificate

Time to complete education: Less than 1 year to 1 year

Heavy Equipment Operators are key members of a construction crew. They operate bulldozers, excavators, rollers, cranes, asphalt and concrete paving equipment and other heavy equipment.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGER

Average Salary: \$34.15/hour | \$71,040/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Time to complete education: 1 year to 2 years

Construction Managers plan, coordinate, and supervise construction projects from start to finish. They create and manage budgets and schedules and hire and coordinate all teams. They confirm that regulations are met throughout the process and communicate with teams, supervisors, and clients regularly. Previous construction experience is required.

SHEET METAL ASSEMBLY

Average Salary: \$24.50/hour | \$50,960/year Education Required: Certificate, Apprenticeship Time to complete education: 1 year, 4 year apprenticeship

Sheet metal workers use pieces of thin steel, aluminum, or other alloyed metal in both manufacturing and construction, often shaping the metal to fit specifications. They interpret blueprints and use specialized tools and equipment for precise work.

BUILDING & CONSTRUCTION WORKER

Average Salary: \$19.00/hour | \$39,520/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Time to complete education: Less than 1 year to 2 years

Building and Construction Workers construct buildings and infrastructure using physical labor and heavy machinery. They create structural frameworks, lay foundations, install electrical and plumbing systems, and apply finishes and tiles.

CARPENTER

Average Salary: \$24.38/hour | \$50,710/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree, Apprenticeship

Time to complete education: 1 year to 2 years, 4 year apprenticeship

Carpenters cut, measure, and shape wood to create building structures and furniture. They interpret blueprints and building plans, are skilled in the operation of various carpentry tools, and are adept at creating accurate measurements.

MASONRY & CONCRETE WORKER

Average Salary: \$23.55/hour | \$48,990/year

Education Required: Certificate

Time to complete education: Less than 1 year to 1 year

Masonry & Concrete Workers build structures with concrete, bricks, and natural stones. They use primarily hand-held tools to smooth mortar and shape stone structures. Masonry Workers often read manuals and technical drawings to determine the details of a task.

GET STARTED IN 1-2 YEARS

WELDER

Average Salary: \$23.30/hour | \$48,460/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Time to complete education: 1-2 Years

Welders use their skills to join metals together with different techniques and forms. Welders use high heat and heavy machinery to repair or create structures and machinery. They interpret blueprints and use a variety of techniques to fine-tune details in welding projects.

HVAC TECHNICIAN

Average Salary: \$26.09/hour | \$54,270/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Time to complete education: 1-2 years

HVAC technicians ensure that heating and air conditioning systems work properly to control the temperature, humidity, and overall air quality in buildings. Some HVAC technicians specialize in one or more aspects of HVAC, such as radiant heating systems, testing and balancing, or commercial refrigeration in establishments such as grocery stores, hotels, and restaurants.



COMPUTER AIDED DRAFTER

Average Salary: \$25.28/hour | \$52,582/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Time to complete education: 2 years

Drafters use software to convert the designs of architects and engineers into precise technical drawings that guide the construction process. Most workers specialize in architectural, civil, electrical, or mechanical drafting and use technical drawings to help design everything from microchips to skyscrapers.

PLUMBER

Average Salary: \$27.72/hour | \$57,660/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree, Apprenticeship

Time to complete education: 1-2 years, 5 year apprenticeship

Plumbers install and maintain piping systems for water, gas, drainage, and plumbing appliances in buildings. Plumbers have a good understanding of blueprints, safety codes, and problem-solving skills to address leaks and other plumbing issues.

ELECTRICIAN

Average Salary: \$28.73/hour | \$59,750/year Education Required: Certificate to Associate Degree Apprenticeship

Time to complete education: 1-2 years, 4 year apprenticeship

Electricians repair, install, and maintain electrical components. They work in various settings, from telephone poles to wiring systems in homes and industrial facilities. Electricians also inspect electrical structures to determine their safety and integrity.
